PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Wow, wow, wow! I am so thrilled to finally have been able to share with you all the conceptual designs, costs, and project details for the construction of a new sanctuary. I am also incredibly heartened by the level of participation that we had at the First Impression Gathering on August 16 and the subsequent Zoom First Impression Gathering that we had the following Tuesday for those who live far away or couldn't attend the in-person gathering.

For anyone who was not able to attend and hasn't seen the case statement with all of the facts and figures, we are proposing to build a new sanctuary and where our current sanctuary stands, we would create a beautiful sanctuary garden courtyard. The leaders of the church believe that this has the potential to increase our capacity for ministry and set St. Peter's on sound footing to share and seek God's love well into the future!

The First Impressions Gathering revealed a great deal of excitement for the plan! People responded with excitement about the open space without columns, the overall design, the built-in flexibility of the space, the natural light and the courtyard! One person responded in their questionnaire that "God is working here!" Another person wrote that they were most excited by "the overall enthusiasm that I feel within the room!"

There have also been so many thoughtful questions that have been raised, mostly to do with how realistic it is to fund a project of this magnitude being a church of our size. I'm so relieved that you all are paying attention! This is a big deal and a question that we take seriously.

Right now, we are in a period of time called a **feasibility study**. By the time this newsletter is shared, we will have had the First Impressions Gatherings, hosted upwards of 20 interviews with a cross section of the congregation, and invited 100% of the congregation to give feedback

through a survey. Horizon Stewardship is the organization that we have hired and are partnering with to help us answer the question of affordability. Can we responsibly take on a project of this financial magnitude?

Right about the time this letter is published, we will be finding out the results of this feasibility study which will give us a range of what our strategist, Don Smith, believes we can raise based on your feedback. So we will know relatively soon whether or not this project is possible.

In the meantime, you have raised such valuable insights that no matter which direction the project takes, the leadership and the architects will be taking into the next phase. Questions like, does this design point us inward towards ourselves, or outward towards the world God so loves? How does this space enable us to serve others? Have you taken into consideration the need for proper acoustics, especially for those with hearing loss? How will we honor the past while making space for what is new?

Now is the time for communication. If you do not feel that you have had an adequate opportunity to share your thoughts, please call the office or email me and set up a time to talk with myself or another member of the council or building steering team.

In the meantime, I stand by what I said in my sermon on August 16; that none of us know what is going to happen when we cast our nets. I thank you for the way you have participated in casting this vision. The only way to know if it's of God is to share it, cast it and see what comes back!

MUSIC NOTES

Sunday school teachers, marketers, hymn writers, rock stars, and kindergarten teachers are all well aware that “what is learned in song is remembered long.” Music is a powerful teaching tool; neuroscience backs this up. Pairing information with music helps our brain retrieve that information with ease; music plus words equals recall.

Throughout the Bible we find “songs”: Miriam’s, Moses’, Isaiah’s, the Psalms, the Song of Solomon, and Mary’s Magnificat, to name just a few. Words set to music to write them onto the hearts of God’s people. Because throughout the Bible, also, we find stories of God’s people forgetting and needing to be called back to remembrance—as do we!

But words set to music do more than just remind us; they also teach us. They lay down the message in our brain and impress upon us their truth. We may often find ourselves humming a song from Sunday’s service even though we can’t remember the details of Pastor’s sermon. (Nothing against Pastor’s sermons!!!) However, if you don’t sing the songs and/or focus on the words, you may miss part of the day’s lessons. Hymns are not chosen willy-nilly, but specifically to augment that day’s readings and message.

Allow the songs to train you in the language of Scripture, sound doctrine, and spiritual disciplines. Let them carve memory paths deep in your mind so that the words can inform, comfort, and motivate you. Let them give you the gift of a good memory in an age of formidable forgetfulness.

Join St. Peter’s team for a 25-mile ride around San Diego Bay. The ride is mostly bike paths, with a few sections of shared road, and a ferry ride return!

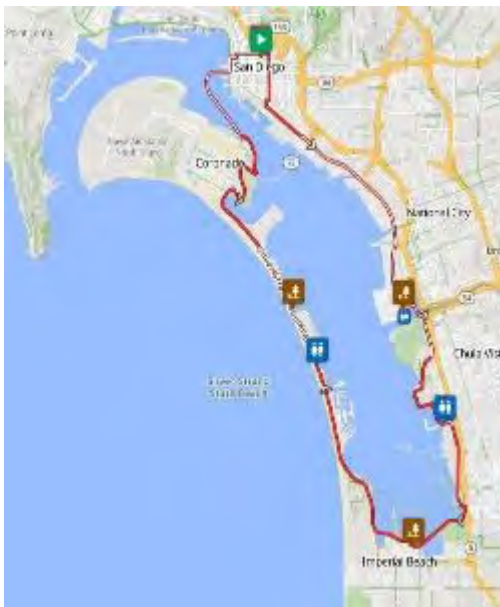

ANCHOR STATION IN OCEAN BEACH

We are excited to be a part of the team of Point Loma/Ocean Beach churches who have gathered together under the umbrella of Love Thy Neighborhood, a nonprofit organization in Point Loma, to open a resource center for our neighbors in need. Seven churches have come together with Love Thy Neighborhood and formed a steering committee with the intent of developing a place similar to the Compass Station in Pacific Beach. It is a place where our neighbors in need can access computers and charging stations along with an existing place to have their mail delivered. The current location will be the Episcopal Center on Sunset Cliffs Blvd. Our Endowment Committee has provided just over \$700 as our contribution to this, and the six other churches are in the process of making contributions also.

The group has decided to launch a pilot period to assess the needs of our neighbors. This is planned to begin mid-September and go until mid-November. After this pilot period, we will have a better idea of what the needs of our neighbors are and we will make adjustments as necessary. We hope to be able to have a permanent presence in Ocean Beach and eventually an array of services that will be helpful to our neighbors in need.

This vision began several years ago with the faith leaders that have been gathering in our community with the leadership of Pastor Bekki. We are excited to launch this and look forward to St. Peter's ongoing support as we discern the ongoing needs.
